THE LAKEVIEW LOUNGE



How about a memorable fall outing, for you and your family? Fully certified naturalists take individuals or groups on customized excursions including local sightseeing tours, hikes, and walks. Please note a 12-hour cancellation policy is in effect. Programs run from October 12th to November 30th. Please consult with the Concierge team for availability and reservations.

JOHNSTON CANYON

One of the must sees in Banff National Park, Johnston Canyon is a geological marvel located just 30 minutes from us along the scenic Bow Valley Parkway. A popular wildlife corridor, you may even spot wildlife on the way. Your hike along the canyon walls on catwalks will bring you to the lower falls with its cave like entrance. You will then journey onwards and upwards with your guide until you reach the spectacular upper falls grotto.

Time: 4 hours

Distance: 5.4km/3.4mi

Elevation Gain: 135m/440 ft

LAKE AGNES

This lovely hike is one of the most popular trails in Banff National Park for a reason: The first switch back lets you look down on the turquoise waters of Lake Louise. Continuing upward from there you will pass Mirror Lake tucked under the sheer cliffs of Big Beehive. Being above the treeline expansive panoramas of the valley will come into view as you head to your destination, a beautiful lake with a waterfall and mountain backdrop.

Time: 4 hours

Distance: 7 km/ 4.4 Mi

Gain: 385m/ 1,260'

THE PLAIN OF SIX GLACIERS

One of the premier hikes in the Canadian Rockies, this trail features an effervescent change in scenery from the lakeshore and forest to dry creek beds, trickling waterfalls, and glacial moraines. Upon reaching our destination you are rewarded with a lush green valley.

Time: 6 hours

Distance: 11 km/ 7 Mi

Gain: 335m / 1,100'

THE LAKE SHORE STROLL

Have you ever wanted to walk into a postcard? This is your chance! Stroll into the picture perfect image of Lake Louise. Once at the end of the lake we may spot rock climbers, ground squirrels, marmots or even spot a mountain goat high on the sheer cliffs of Mt. Fairview. This walk is suitable for all ages and abilities.

Time: 2 hours

Distance: 4km/ 2.4mi

Gain: None

WHAT TO WEAR?

Don't let a lack of special gear keep you from one of our most rewarding experiences. The trick to being comfortable outdoors is to dress in layers. A sweater, wind/water proof jacket, sunglasses, sunscreen and hat are recommended. Make sure your footwear is flat-soled and hiking or winter boots are best. Finally, don't forget to bring a bottle of water and your camera, of course. Technical equipment such as boots, hiking poles, gators, ice cleats and backpacks are provided if needed.

Banff Zipline Tours combine adventure with environmental education. The refreshing one-hour tour will have three dual lines. The dual lines allow 12 guests per group to “zip” side-by-side, enhancing this exhilarating experience. The ziplines range from 90 meters to 450 meters in length. The lines descend down the mountainside and across the rushing Kicking Horse River at speeds over 60 km per hour. Interpretive short walks between each line, allow the guests to learn about nature first hand, discovering the history and mountain ecology of the area. Tours depart every hour on the hour from 9:00 am to 8:00 pm. There is a minimum weight requirement of 66 lbs and a maximum of 270 lbs. Tours operated year round. Please note a 48-hour cancellation policy is in effect. Transportation is not included unless done in combination with the ATV tour. Reservations are required.

You will be shuttled through the majestic Canadian Rocky Mountains to beautiful British Columbia where you will be suited up with helmets for your awesome adventure. Spend three hours roaming through wooded trails and breathtaking mountainsides. Your guide will take you to beautiful vistas and unsurpassed heights so bring your camera. There is a light snack included as well. Minimum age to operate a machine is 16 years old with a driver's license, and under 16 years they must share a machine with an older rider. Daily departures from Lake Louise are 8:45 am and 11:45 am. Guests should account for 6 hours until you arrive back at the hotel for the half-day tour. A 48-hour cancellation policy is in effect. During the Pleistocene Glaciations of the past 1.6 million years, the dynamic melt waters of the ancient glaciers cleaved and carved the limestone rock in the Bow Valley to create Rats Nest Cave: a 4-km long cave system. In present day, the energetic waters have receded (as in the past) leaving behind their traces of glacial deposits, fossil animal bones, pools of sparkling clear water and glistening calcite formations, all for you to discover on a cave tour. As you hike up to the cave entrance through the pine forest, you will look down on the Bow River as it flows along the impressive glacial valley that once contained the cave-forming glaciers. The adventure begins with a 20-30 minute hike up a mountain trail to the entrance. Knowledgeable guides take you on a Natural History tour of this exciting underground world - etched and sculptured over hundreds of thousands of years - through twisting passages and chambers of stalactites & stalagmites, animal bones and fossils. Canmore is located 1-hour east of Lake Louise. Transportation is not included. Please note the 48-hour cancellation policy.

A pack of 6 orphan wolves live in a 1.25 acre habitat, acting as ambassadors for their wild cousins. A visit to the Northern Lights Wolf Centre will afford you the opportunity to be in close, but safe proximity with these marvelous creatures, and also learn about the wolves' important role in a healthy ecosystem. The centre is located a 1-hour drive west of Lake Louise on the Trans Canada Highway 1. Reservations are only necessary for a photo session with the wolves. You will luxuriate in the comfort of soothing hot springs where travellers have come to “take the waters” for more than a century. Located in Banff, a 55-minute drive from Lake Louise. The Banff Gondola is located just 5 minutes from the town of Banff on the shoulder of Sulphur Mountain. The 360° view from the upper gondola terminal, view-decks and Summit Ridge interpretive boardwalk, are great vantage points for views of the surrounding mountains. Safely seated in 4 passenger gondola cabins, visitors are transported in 8 minutes to the summit at an elevation of 2,281m (7,486 ft) above sea level. Awaiting you at the end of an 8-minute gondola ride to the top of Sulphur Mountain is a unique complex of visitor services including restaurants, gift shop and numerous outdoor observation decks.

Alberta's official gemstone, Ammolite, is a very rare and valuable stone found only in Southern Alberta. Colourful ammolite gemstones come from fossil shells of the ammonite sea creature that lived in a warm inland sea 70 million years ago! The Ammonite factory located in Canmore, has been a miner and producer of ammolite for over 20 years. The factory and showroom are open Monday through Saturday from 10:00am to 5:00pm and Sundays from 12:00pm to 5:00pm. Factory tours are run at 10:00am, 11:00am and 12:00pm daily. Reservations are not required. This activity operates year-round.

SCENIC DRIVES

THE BOW VALLEY PARKWAY HIGHWAY 1A

This scenic alternative to Highway 1 between Banff and Lake Louise, the Bow Valley Parkway has many points of interest to be discovered. There's the geological marvel, Johnston Canyon, the memorial in honour of Ukrainian internees, and the scenery of poplar forests, quiet meadows, and the Bow River.

THE ICEFIELDS PARKWAY HIGHWAY 93 NORTH

Considered by many to be one of the best drives in North America, the Icefields Parkway is absolutely stunning. The road winds beside serene lakes and rushing rivers overlooking snowcapped mountain peaks and majestic glaciers. Points of interest include the Columbia Icefield, the largest mass of ice in the Rocky Mountains.

HIGHWAY 1 WEST & YOHO NATIONAL PARK

Just west of us, in the beautiful province of British Columbia, is the rugged and nearly untouched wilderness of Yoho National Park. Accessible by Highway 1 West, Yoho is home to the rich green coloured, Emerald Lake, the natural rock formation, the natural bridge, and the engineering marvel, the Spiral Tunnels. This is a great option for a half-day outing.

HIGHWAY 93 SOUTH & KOOTENAY NATIONAL PARK

A popular wildlife corridor, the Highway 93 South leads you into the uniquely different, Kootenay National Park. One of the worst fires in Rockies history ravaged through this area in 2003. But in proof that beauty can come from ashes, the resulting scenery is a photographer's paradise. Charred wood juxtaposes vibrant green vegetation and gloriously blue waters. Points of interest include Stanley Glacier, Marble Canyon, and further south the town of Radium, famous for hot springs.
